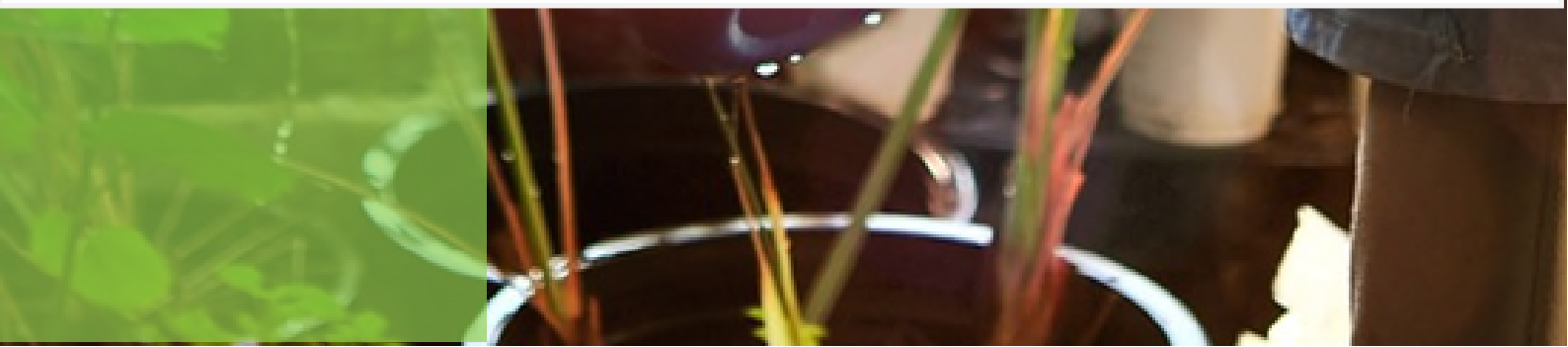

Wheelchair/Trolley Hire:

Dogs & Animals:

Dogs & Animals are not permitted at the Cairns Show! If you bring an animal with you will be denied entry. Exceptions to this: Service & Guide Dogs, or Animals approved for medical purposes (certificate/identification of approval will need to be shown to gate staff/security). Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

4. Please note: a Transaction Fee Per Order will be payable to the Ticketing Merchant for all Ticket Orders online and in person.
5. By purchasing a Ticket, you agree to the Terms & Conditions outlined on our website.

PRESOLD TICKETS

In the event of any conflict between these rules and regulations, those outlined in the Schedule of this Society shall take precedence. By participating in any class outlined in this Schedule, all individuals agree to indemnify the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION against liability for any accidents, damages, losses, or illnesses to any Exhibit, Exhibitor, or Competitor. Additionally, participants acknowledge that all Competitions are under the complete control of the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION, whose decisions in all matters are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
4. **The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.**
5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

The Prize Money listed in the Schedule does not include GST. GST will be added to the Prize Money for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.

HOW TO ENTER

1. Fully complete the Official Entry Form (please use a separate form for each Section) account details for winners will need to be provided after the Show to the Cairns Show office.
2. Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
3. Deliver completed Entry Forms including fees applicable to Cairns Show Association, Honey Providore Horticulture Pavilion 8am-6pm Tuesday 16th July.
4. Exhibits must be delivered to the designated part of the ground by the due time and date shown.

AFTER THE SHOW

1. Exhibits must be collected between 7am-9am on Saturday 20th July 2024 or will automatically become property of the Cairns Show Association.
2. Prize Money and Certificate cannot be collected on Friday or Saturday.
3. Prize Money and Prize Certificates can be collected between 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday, from 5th August to the 30th August 2024 from the Show Office.
4. Proof of identity is required to collect Prize Money. If you are collecting prize money on behalf of someone else, a letter of authorisation from that person will be required.
5. All Prize Money not collected (Bar Non-Local) by 4pm on 30th August 2024 will be returned to the Cairns Show Association Funds.
6. Prize Money over \$50 will be deposited to Non-Locals after 30th August 2024.
7. For the above purposes, a 'local' is described as residing between the areas of Palm Cove and Gordonvale and west to the range.
8. Results will be available AFTER the Show has concluded from the Cairns Show Website www.cairnsshow.com.au.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

1. Refer to General Conditions of Entry and Competition in front of Schedule.
2. All exhibitors must fill in entry forms which must be lodged with exhibits.
3. All exhibitors in this Section to be under 18 years of age.
4. All exhibits must be produced on property of exhibitor. Proved infringement of this rule may lead to cancellation of entry.
5. Exhibits must not be removed without permission of the Stewards.
6. In every case except Champion or unless otherwise stated, no entry shall be eligible to compete in more than one class.
7. Where a weight of produce is required, the weight should be written within 10% of the weight required.
8. Exhibits should be sound, clean, mature but not over ripe, and fresh, without blemish and free from disease and without damage by pests.
9. Where specified numbers are called for, such as three carrots, one dozen eggs, one Bunch of celery etc, these numbers must be benched - more or less will disqualify the entry.
10. Small fruit and vegetable such as chillies or cherry tomatoes to be displayed on small plates or foil pie dishes.
11. Uniformity of size is important in the selection of an exhibit where more than one is called for.
12. No free passes are available to exhibitors.
13. If entering as a school, please note the name of the school on the entry form. The school's name given will be used to write the prize certificates.

Root Vegetables Note: Root vegetables such as carrots & turnips must have foliage intact, should be completely immersed in deep cold water for a few hours prior to benching to ensure freshness of foliage & crispness of the root portion.

Class 19006 Carrots - Any Variety - 3 Only

Class 19007 Eschallots - 3 Stalks

Class 19008 Radish - Any Variety - 3 Only

VEGETABLES - LEAF

Green Vegetables Note: Green vegetables such as lettuce, china cabbage, etc. should be picked with the roots intact and may be benched with the roots immersed in a small container of water, or the roots may be wrapped in damp paper mache or cotton wool. This will ensure their remaining fresh throughout the length of the Show.

Leaf Vegetables Note: Leaf vegetables such as silverbeet should be immersed in cold water for some time prior to benching and the ends of the stems should be wrapped with mache or some such moisture retaining substance.
