Dogs & Animals:

Dogs & Animals are not permitted at the Cairns Show! If you bring an animal with you will be denied entry. Exceptions to this: Service & Guide Dogs, or Animals approved for medical purposes (certificate/identification of approval will need to be shown to gate staff/security). Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

This Show operates under the regulations set forth by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution, and rules of this Society, as well as any regulations specified within the individual sections of this Show's Schedule. In the event of any conflict between these rules and regulations, those outlined in the Schedule of this Society shall take precedence. By participating in any class outlined in this Schedule, all individuals agree to indemnify the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION against liability for any accidents, damages, losses, or illnesses to any Exhibit, Exhibitor, or Competitor. Additionally, participants acknowledge that all Competitions are under the complete control of the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION, whose decisions in all matters are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

- 1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
- 2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
- 3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
- 4. The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.
- 5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
- 6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

- 1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
- 2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
- 3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

The Prize Money listed in the Schedule does not include GST. GST will be added to the Prize Money for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

HOW TO ENTER

- 1. Complete an Entry online or in person at the Cairns Show Office, or post via PO Box 811 Bungalow, QLD 4870.
- 2. Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
- 3. Pay for Entry Fees online, by direct deposit, or in person at the Cairns Show Office (cash accepted).
- 4. Entries must be delivered to the designated part of the Showgrounds by the due date time and date shown.
- 5. Exhibitors will receive Entry and Class Cards.
- 6. All Class cards to be placed on the bottom right-hand side of exhibit and Envelopes must be attached on the back of exhibit prior to delivery.


AFTER THE SHOW

- 1. Exhibits not collected by 30th August 2024 will automatically become the property of the Cairns Show Association.
- 2. Prize money under the value of \$50 and Prize Certificates can be collected between 9am and 4pm, Monday to Friday, from Monday 5th August to Friday 30th August 2024 from the Show Office.
- 3. Any prize money over the value of \$50 will be directly deposited to your account from Monday 5th August to Friday 30th August.
- 4. Proof of identity is required to collect Prize Money. If you are collecting prize money on behalf of someone else, a letter of authorization from that person will be required.
- 5. Entrants who have not provided their account details will be contacted via the details presented on their Entry Form.
- 6. ALL Prize Money not collected by 4pm on Friday 30th August 2024 will be returned to the Cairns Show Association Funds and unable to be collected.
- 7. A 'local' is defined as residing between the areas of Palm Cove & Gordonvale and west to the range.
- 8. Results will be available AFTER the conclusion of the Show from the Cairns Show Website www.cairnsshow.com.au.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

PLEASE READ SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CLASS YOU ARE ENTERING THOROUGHLY

- 1. Refer to General Conditions of Entry and Competition in the front of this Schedule.
- 2. All exhibits must be the sole work of the exhibitor/s. Exhibits created in tutored workshops are accepted for competition in Class 24025 only.
- 3. Each exhibit may be entered in only one (1) class.
- 4. All exhibits must be completed in the twelve (12) months prior to the 2023 Cairns Show.
- 5. Exhibits entered in previous Cairns Shows are accepted for competition in Class 24024 only and must be reconstructed into an original exhibit different from the one previously judged.
- 6. The Judge reserves the right to alter the Class of an exhibit.
- 7. Exhibits in Classes 24001, 24002, 24003, 24004, 24017 to be accompanied by a completed sample (minimum 10 cm square), mounted on A5 size WHITE heavy card.
- 8. Attach a sample of raw material to exhibits in Classes 24001, 24002, 24003, 24004, 24009, 24010, 24017, 24018, 24019, 24020, 24021 and 24024.
- Exhibits in class 24022, a joint effort must be accompanied by a description of materials and technique/s used, must reflect the shared work of two (2) or more people and will be judged as one (1) exhibit. Prize-winning joint exhibits will have full points awarded to each participant.
- 10. To assist the Stewards in arranging and dispatching the exhibits after the Show, attach a sealed envelope containing the owner's name and address to the back of each exhibit. Name and address must also be printed on the back of the class cards.
- 11. All exhibits forwarded by mail must include return postage.
- 12. No free passes available to exhibitors.
- 13. Exhibits for sale must be marked clearly with price. Exhibits not for sale must be marked clearly "NFS". Sold items must remain until Saturday of Show.
- 14. Commission of 20% will apply to all exhibits sold and must be included in the sale price. Please liaise with the Chief Steward.

SPINNING

Class 24001 Novice - Hand-Spun Yarn Not more than 3 years' experience, and not previously awarded a prize in classes 24001, 24002, 24003 or 24004. Piled, natural fibre, no blends, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres), washed. Class 24002 Natural Fibre - Hand-Spun Yarn Natural fibre, no blends, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres), washed. Class 24003 Fibre Blend - Hand-Spun Yarn Fibre blend, commercial optional, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres), washed. Class 24004 Designer - Hand-Spun Yarn Hand-Spun Designer Yarn, not less than 25% hand-spun fibre, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres).

DYEING

Class 32002 Natural Dyes - Hand-Dyed Yarn Natural dyes, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres), washed. Class 32003 Commercial Dyes - Hand-Dyed Yarn Commercial dyes, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres), washed. Class 32004 Natural or Commercial Dyes - Hand-Dyed Article or Garment

WEAVING

Class 32005 Hand-Woven Fabric Any Medium. Class 32006 100% Hand-Spun Yarn - Hand-Woven Article or Garment Natural fibre/s. Class 32007 Any Medium - Hand-Woven Article or Garment Class 32008 Hand-Woven Tapestry Weaving Any Medium, framed or unframed, ready to hang.

FELTING

Class 32009 Hand-Felted - Wearable Garment or Accessory Any Techniques - Example: sculpture, bag, shawl. Class 32010 Hand-Felted - Non-Wearable Article Any Techniques - Example: sculpture, rug, wall piece. Class 32011 Nuno Felted - Wearable Art Garment or Article

BASKETRY

Class 32012 Hand-Woven Article Using Basketry Techniques, Any Medium. Class 32013 Hand-Crafted Basketry or Sculpture Using Techniques other than weaving, Any Medium - Example: coiling, sewing, wrapping.

SINGLE EFFORT - CONTINUED

OTHER TECHNIQUES

Class 32015 Hand-Crafted Unique Creative Yarn

Using Techniques other than spinning or pyling, 1 skein (minimum 25 metres) - Any Medium. Fibre, yarn, fabric, plastic, wire or liked, must be stable for the end use.

Class 32016 Hand-Crafted Article or Sculpture

Using only RECYCLED materials. Example: fabric, plastic, paper. Attached a sample of raw material or photo a sample of items used in the whole work cannot be obtained. Write a brief description of materials and techniques used.

Class 32017 Lace Item

Any item created from at least two types of lace. Example: hairpin, teneriffe crochet, bobbin, tatting, etc. Class 32018 Lace Article or Garment

Any Technique (describe briefly) and Any Medium.

Class 32019 Fibrecrafting Techniques - Hand-Crafted Article or Garment

Using a minimum of 3 Fibrecrafting Techniques. Examples: knitting, dyeing, felting, etc. Description of Techniques used and Any Medium.

Class 32020 Knitted or Crocheted from Yarn - Hand-Crafted Article or Garment

Any Article or Garment knitted or crocheted from any yarn (included natural or synthetic fibres, hand or commercial spun).

JOINT EFFORT

Class 24023 Hand-Crafted Article or Garment/ Other Any Technique/s, Any Medium, Any Other Article.

ANY OTHER ARTICLE

Class 24024 Original Article Reconstructed From a previous judged article. See Special Regulation 5. Class 24025 Any Other Article Not Specified

SPECIAL CLASS

Class 24026 Finished - Hand-Crafted Yarn, Article or Garment Created in a Tutored Work Using Fibrecrafting Techniques with any fabric, material or yarn (if applicable, 1 skein minimum 25 metres) This is open to all workshop attendees, not just these convened by Fibrecrafters FNQ Inc.

Most points overall in classes 24001 to 24026
