Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

### ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website [www.cairnsshow.com.au](http://www.cairnsshow.com.au).
2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
  - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
  - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
  - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS

1. PLEASE READ SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CLASS YOU ARE ENTERING THOROUGHLY
2. Refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition on page 7 of schedule.
3. **Honey exhibited in Classes 17001 to 17005 must be displayed in the Standard Trade Jar. The Jar is round (not panelled) and of clear glass with a white top. It must contain 500g reputed net weight of honey.**
  1. **Height - 120mm**
  2. **Cap Diameter - 62mm**
  3. **To expedite judging, jars should be filled to capacity, an air of space approximately 6mm should be left at the top of the jar.**
4. All exhibitors must fill in entry forms which must be lodged with exhibits.
5. All exhibits must be the property of and the produce of the exhibitor's own apiary or apiaries with the exception of Mead classes where the honey may be purchased by the Exhibitor for the purpose of mead making. Proved infringement of this rule may lead to cancellation of entry.
6. The Exhibitor's name must not appear on any exhibit.
7. All exhibits must be delivered to the Cairns Showgrounds Honey Providore Horticulture Pavilion between 9am and 12pm (noon) on Monday 15th July 2024. All exhibits dispatched for entry are the responsibility of the exhibitor The Association will not be responsible for the loss of, or any damage whatsoever to exhibits or their late arrival.
8. Please advise stewards if you would like your entry/produce back. You will need to collect this from the Pavilion on Saturday 20th July 2024 between 7.00am and 9am.
9. Exhibits must not be removed without permission of the Stewards.
10. Unless otherwise instructed by the Exhibitor, any exhibit not collected by 10am on Saturday 20th July will become the property of the Cairns Show Association.
11. Where multiple entries are made by any one Exhibitor in any one class it is essential that individual exhibits be derived from geographically diverse apiaries.
12. Judging will be conducted by Judge/s appointed by the Association.
13. Where, in the opinion of the Judge, an entry is entered in the wrong class, the Judge may refer the matter to the Steward, and upon recommendation of the Judge and at the discretion of the Steward, such entry may be transferred to the class for which it is eligible.
14. The Exhibitor irrevocably consents to the Cairns Show Association and the Cairns and District Beekeepers' Association Inc publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars of information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.
15. No free passes are available to exhibitors.
