

Exceptions to this: Service & Guide Dogs, or Animals approved for medical purposes (certificate/identification of approval will need to be shown to gate staff/security). Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

This Show operates under the regulations set forth by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution, and rules of this Society, as well as any regulations specified within the individual sections of this Show's Schedule. In the event of any conflict between these rules and regulations, those outlined in the Schedule of this Society shall take precedence. By participating in any class outlined in this Schedule, all individuals agree to indemnify the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION against liability for any accidents, damages, losses, or illnesses to any Exhibit, Exhibitor, or Competitor. Additionally, participants acknowledge that all Competitions are under the complete control of the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION, whose decisions in all matters are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

- 1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
- 2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
- 3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
- 4. The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.
- 5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
- 6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

- 1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
- 2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
- 3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

The Prize Money listed in the Schedule does not include GST. GST will be added to the Prize Money for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.

AFTER THE SHOW

- 1. Exhibits must be collected between 7am-9am on Saturday 20th July 2024 or will automatically become property of the Cairns Show Association.
- 2. Prize Money and Certificate cannot be collected on Friday or Saturday.
- 3. Prize Money and Prize Certificates can be collected between 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday, from 5th August to the 30th August 2024 from the Show Office.
- 4. Proof of identity is required to collect Prize Money. If you are collecting prize money on behalf of someone else, a letter of authorisation from that person will be required.
- 5. All Prize Money not collected (Bar Non-Local) by 4pm on 30th August 2024 will be returned to the Cairns Show Association Funds.
- 6. Prize Money over \$50 will be deposited to Non-Locals after 30th August 2024.
- 7. For the above purposes, a 'local' is described as residing between the areas of Palm Cove and Gordonvale and west to the range.
- 8. Results will be available AFTER the Show has concluded from the Cairns Show Website www.cairnsshow.com.au.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition in front of Schedule.
- 2. All exhibitors must fill in entry forms which must be lodged with exhibits.
- 3. All exhibits in the Cut Flower Classes must be grown by the exhibitor or family. Pot Culture Exhibits, including Orchids, must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 6 months prior to the Show. Proved infringement of either of these rules may lead to cancellation of entry. Flowers used in Floral Art Classes may not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor. Materials used may be bought or obtained from any other source.
- 4. In every case except Aggregates, Champions or unless otherwise stated, no individual entry shall be eligible to compete in more than one class. Points allotted for aggregates and other special awards are as follows: 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, 1 for 3rd, 3 extra for Champion and 6 extra for Grand Champion and 3 extra for Reserve Champion.
- 5. Containers are provided by the Show Association for Cut Flowers and Flowering Shrubs.
- 6. Orchid exhibitors must provide their own containers which should have an identifying mark.
- 7. Floral Art designs must be displayed as a single unit (i.e. provide a base if the design is composed of several parts).
- 8. No entries in Pot Culture, Orchids or Floral Art may be removed from hall before 8.30pm Friday 19th July 2024. Exhibits can also be collected Saturday 20th July between 7am-9am.
- 9. No free passes are available to exhibitors.
- 10. Judging will conform with the Standards as laid down by the Far North Queensland Horticultural Society.



POT CULTURE

The Pot Culture Subsection is managed by Members of the Cairns Garden Club Inc.

KEY INFORMATION

Entry Fee: FREE

Entries Close: 7pm Monday 15th July. Entries are welcome from those who reside within the Cairns Regional

Council area as well as those who live in areas outside of this.

Delivery of Exhibits: 2pm-7pm Monday 15th July.

Judging: 10am Tuesday 16th July.

Collection of Plants: 8:30pm-9pm Friday 19th July, or 7am-9am Saturday 20th July. Any exhibits NOT collected by 9am Saturday 20th July 2024 automatically become the property of the Cairns Show Association.

Points:

- 1. Culture = 4 points.
- 2. Symmetry & Finish = 3 points.
- 3. Pot = 3 points.
- 4. Total = 10 points

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition located in the front of the Schedule, along with the Special Regulations of Section 22 Horticulture.

Entries Per Class: Not more than 4 entries per plant class per person.

Pots: Plastic only - not exceeding 9 litre capacity.

Baskets: Not to exceed 350mm in diameter - clean.

Supports: Stakes, wires, hoops etc allowed.

Plants: In proportion to pot size - clean and healthy (no dead leaves or insect damage).

Ownership: Entries to be in exhibitors possession for at least six months.

Definitions:

- 1. Single stemmed plants should be planted singularly.
- 2. Plants suckering may have multiple stems, parent stem to be in good condition.
- 3. Foliage plant is grown for foliage.
- 4. Flowering plant grown for flowers should have multiple flowers.
- 5. Mixed planting no less than 3 distinct plants arranged to fill pot or basket.

Entries may be refused or cancelled if the above conditions are not met.
