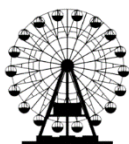

Dogs & Animals are not permitted at the Cairns Show! If you bring an animal with you will be denied entry. Exceptions to this: Service & Guide Dogs, or Animals approved for medical purposes (certificate/identification of approval will need to be shown to gate staff/security). Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
4. **The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.**
5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

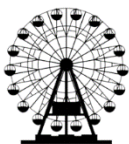

KEY INFORMATION

Entry Fee: \$5 per Scarecrow.

Entries Close: 4pm Friday 11th July.

Delivery of Exhibits: 12pm-6pm Tuesday 15th July - Honey Providore Horticulture Pavilion (Cairns Youth & Recreational Centre).

Judging: Thursday 17th July.

Prize:

1. Group Classes: 1st - \$200 + Sash, 2nd - \$100, 3rd - \$50
2. Individual Classes: 1st - \$100 + Sash, 2nd - \$50, 3rd - \$25

Collection of Exhibits: MUST be collect between 7am-9am Saturday 19th July. If unable to collect, the exhibit will become Property of the Cairns Show Association, unless arrangement is made with the Competitions Coordinator prior to Closing of Entries.

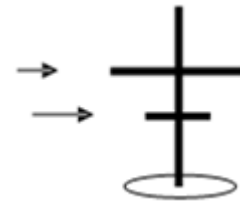
CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Each Scarecrow can only be entered into one category.
2. Maximum height to be no more than 2.5 Metres.
3. Stake diameter to be no wider than 25mm.
4. Scarecrows must be free standing; no base will be provided.
5. Class cards will be sent via mail before the Show.

HOW TO MAKE A SCARECROW

Frame:

1. 1 x long wooden or bamboo garden stake.
2. Stakes diameter to be no wider than 25mm.
3. 1 x shorter stake to make the arms.
4. An additional smaller stake can be used to make the waist.
5. Use String, twine or nails to tie the frame together.
6. Tie the stakes together in a cross shape to make your frame.
7. Maximum height of Scarecrow to be no more than 2.5 Metres.



IDEA: Use a mop or broom as the frame, turn it upside down and the mop or broom head can become the Scarecrows head!

Base:

1. Make sure your Scarecrow is freestanding. Use a Hay Bale, Umbrella Stand or even sit your Scarecrow in a chair.

Clothes, Arms, & Legs:

1. Use old clothes to dress your Scarecrow. Visit local charity shops for old clothes and shoes.
2. Place clothes over the frame.
3. Stuff the arms and legs with straw, old material or newspaper.
4. If using trousers put one of the legs through the frame and secure, leave the other leg outside the frame and use stuffing to form the shape. Make sure that you securely tie up the ends of the arms and legs.

Head:

1. Pillowcase, bag or material that can be stuffed to form a head.
2. Paint or markers to draw on a face.

IDEA: If you like to get your hands dirty use paper-mache to make the head.

Hands:

1. Washing up gloves, stockings, mittens, straw or lavender.

IDEA: If using straw or lavender push this into the arms and legs of the clothes, allowing the straw or lavender to stick out to make the hands and feet. Use string or twine around the end of the sleeves to keep the straw in place.

Feet:

1. Socks or old shoes.
2. Use lots of Accessories to make your Scarecrow unique!

TRADITIONAL

These Scarecrows will be typically old-fashioned figures constructed from throw-aways from the farm such as clothing, hay, stuffing, burlap, farm implements, or farm produce (corn husks, vegetables, pumpkins, etc.).

3. All exhibits must be the property of and the produce of the exhibitor's own apiary or apiaries with the exception of Mead classes where the honey may be purchased by the Exhibitor for the purpose of mead making. Proved infringement of this rule may lead to cancellation of entry.
4. The Exhibitor's name must not appear on any exhibit.
5. All exhibits must be delivered to the Cairns Showgrounds Honey Providore Horticulture Pavilion between 9am and 12pm (noon) on Monday 14th July 2025. All exhibits dispatched for entry are the responsibility of the exhibitor. The Cairns Show Association will not be responsible for the loss of, or any damage whatsoever to exhibits or their late arrival.
