Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

This Show operates under the regulations set forth by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution, and rules of this Society, as well as any regulations specified within the individual sections of this Show's Schedule. In the event of any conflict between these rules and regulations, those outlined in the Schedule of this Society shall take precedence. By participating in any class outlined in this Schedule, all individuals agree to indemnify the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION against liability for any accidents, damages, losses, or illnesses to any Exhibit, Exhibitor, or Competitor. Additionally, participants acknowledge that all Competitions are under the complete control of the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION, whose decisions in all matters are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

- 1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
- 2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
- 3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
- 4. The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.
- 5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
- 6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

- 1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
- 2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
- 3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.


PRIZE MONEY & GST

HOW TO ENTER

- 1. The Schedule will be published on Nominate.com.au and participants are to enter via that platform.
- 2. No phone entries or late entries will be accepted. There are no exceptions.
- 3. Payment will be required on entry via Nominate.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Terms used in the Schedule:
 - CUR Closed UnRestricted.
 - CR Closed Restricted.
 - OC Official Competitive.
 - ALL classes are included. Riders may not compete in Official and CUR/CR competitions on the same horse.
- 2. Only compete in two consecutive levels per event (regardless of number of days). E.g.: Preparatory/Preliminary, Preliminary/Novice, Novice/Elementary, Elementary/Medium, Medium/Advanced.
- 3. Nominations not to exceed a maximum of three tests per day, per horse/rider combination. Rule change January 2025.
- 4. After the close of entries any change of rider must be notified, in writing, to the OC no later than 40 minutes prior to the start of the competition. However, a rider of a horse may not be changed if another rider has ridden the horse on the day, either in warm-up or in a competition.
- 5. One rider per horse, a horse cannot be substituted.
- 6. Junior riders (0 to 16yrs) age as of 1st January 2025. Junior riders may enter one age group only.
- 7. Young riders (12 yrs up to and including 21 years) age as of 1st January 2025.
- 8. Senior Riders (17 years onwards) age as of 1st January 2025.
- 9. All riders are required to help throughout the event, if no preference is nominated on the entry form, then you will be allocated a job by the organising committee.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition in front of schedule.
- 2. The Dressage Events are held under Equestrian Australia Dressage rules.
- 3. Neither the organising Committee of any competition to which these rules apply, nor the Far North Equestrian Group (FNEG) accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.
- 4. **Riders must be members of the FNEG, OR be full members of the EA**, to be at a participative level or take a day membership of FNEG to compete. To join FNEG please go to the Nominate Platform: https://www.nominate.com.au/Clubs/
- 5. **Waiver Forms:** must be signed and submitted with your entries. Riders compete at their own risk and must abide by the competition rules of the EA and FNEG.
- 6. **Helmets:** Helmets are compulsory and must conform to EA approved helmet regulations and be tagged prior to the event. For more information on legal helmets please visit Helmet Tagging | Equestrian Queensland from 1st July 2023 all Dressage riders must have an officially tagged helmet. For more details visit: https://www.equestrian.org.au/content/helmet-tagging-information
- Refunds: No refund on nomination fees will be given after the closing date unless a Vet's or Doctor's certificate is produced. 30% of the nomination fee will be withheld by the club for administration.
- 8. **Stabling:** Stabling/day yards are available on the competition grounds for horses competing on the day. Stables need to be booked directly through Venue Management: karen@crystalcascadeshorsepark.com.au. Cost is \$15/Night. Preference for stables is given to participants travelling from outside Cairns and camping at the grounds. All horses staying overnight on the Crystal Cascades Horse Park must be Hendra Vaccinated and certified up to date.
- 9. **Presentation of Ribbons and Prize Money:** There will be a presentation of ribbons and prize money with Show Officials and Sponsors in attendance after the last test on Sunday.
- 10. **Draw:** You will be sent a copy of the draw via email. Please check the draw for your task and please be on time for these tasks. If you do not receive a copy of the draw by Wednesday 9th July it is your responsibility to email the FNEG Secretary fneg.info@gmail.com.
- 11. **RULE CHANGE:** From the 1 January 2024 all competitors are required to present to the Steward and complete a gear check immediately after riding each test. The steward may conduct a visual inspection when you enter the warmup area however the formal gear check now occurs immediately after completion of the test. Failure to have a gear check after your test will result in elimination.
- 12. **Tasks/Jobs:** All Competitors should expect to be allocated a job each day of the competition, usually 2 hours duration. Nominate your preferred task on the entry form though the Committee who will allocate tasks as needed.
- 13. **Tests:** Copies of all tests are on the EA National Website.
- 14. BYO: Cold drinks and food. Tea and coffee are available on the grounds.
- 15. Dogs: are not allowed onto the Crystal Cascades Horse Park grounds at all.
- 16. It is recommended that all horses be plaited as a sign of respect for the judges.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to alter, amend or cancel any event on the program without notice.

OFFICIAL COMPETITIONS

- 1. All Official EA competitions, with the exception of National and State Championships and Prix St Georges Challenge, are open to both horses and ponies. Any pony entries received shall be grouped at the beginning or the end of the draw (or at another time if the OC requires) and shall be scored as a separate competition to the horses in the rest of the test though separate prizes will not be awarded.
- 2. EA official riders must enter Official competitions at their graded level or above or ride HC in competitions below their level; however, HC competitors will not be eligible for prize money.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure the nominations are made correctly at the horses graded level at the time of entry close date.
- 4. Dress code as per EA current rules and regulations.
- 5. Horses entered in official competitions must be:
 - Registered with the EA and owned by a current financial EA member.
 - Have EA registration papers available on the day of event.
 - Have a current Dressage Performance Card.
 - Identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse either on the bridle or saddle cloth.
- 6. Riders may enter Official competition:
 - From the start of the calendar year, they turn 10 years of age when riding horses.
 - From the start of the calendar year, they turn 8 years of age when riding ponies.
 - Provided they are a Junior or Senior financial member of the EA.
- 7. CUR and CR COMPETITIONS
- 8. No restriction on age for riders, no restriction on the height of the horse/pony
- 9. If a horse/pony is graded, it may only compete at its graded level or higher, or HC at a lower level
- 10. Identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse either on the bridle or saddle cloth.
- 11. Dress code sleeved shirts and tie, stock or Ratcatcher. Jackets are optional in hot weather.
