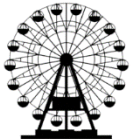

Next to the Show Office, Volunteers from the FNQ Hospital Foundation will look after your items while you enjoy the Show. There is FREE sunscreen available.

Wheelchair/Trolley Hire:

Unfortunately, we do not have Wheelchair or Trolley Hire at the Cairns Show. Please come prepared and refer to the Cairns Show Map for Rest and First Aid locations.

Dogs & Animals:

Dogs & Animals are not permitted at the Cairns Show! If you bring an animal with you will be denied entry. Exceptions to this: Service & Guide Dogs, or Animals approved for medical purposes (certificate/identification of approval will need to be shown to gate staff/security). Competitors competing in the Cairns Show Association Dog Show Championship will be able to enter the Dog Show/Campgrounds areas only – please enter via Quigley St.

3. Tickets can be purchased At the Gates during the Show. Cashless payment is preferred, however, limited ATMS will be available around the grounds. Please refer to the Cairns Show Map for ATM locations.
4. Please note: a Transaction Fee Per Order will be payable to the Ticketing Merchant for all Ticket Orders online and in person.
5. By purchasing a Ticket, you agree to the Terms & Conditions outlined on our website.

PRESOLD TICKETS

You can buy discounted Presold Tickets either online at www.cairnsshow.com.au or at Earlville Shopping Town from Friday 5th to Monday 14th July, between 9am and 5pm. On Tuesday 15th July, tickets will be available at the Main Gates of the Cairns Showgrounds from 9am to 5pm, but only online purchases will be available after 5pm.

GENERAL CONDITIONS – COMPETITIONS

ENTRY & COMPETITIONS

This Show operates under the regulations set forth by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution, and rules of this Society, as well as any regulations specified within the individual sections of this Show's Schedule. In the event of any conflict between these rules and regulations, those outlined in the Schedule of this Society shall take precedence. For detailed information on the rules and regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, please visit www.queenslandshows.com.au.

By participating in any class outlined in this Schedule, all individuals agree to indemnify the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION against liability for any accidents, damages, losses, or illnesses to any Exhibit, Exhibitor, or Competitor. Additionally, participants acknowledge that all Competitions are under the complete control of the CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION, whose decisions in all matters are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

1. No Competition Entries or Membership Applications will be taken over the phone.
2. A Chief Steward will be assigned to each Section to represent it in all matters. Failure to adhere to lawful directions from appointed Stewards, Committee, or Staff, or engaging in verbal or physical abuse, will result in Disciplinary Action, which may include exclusion from further Competitions and/or the Cairns Showgrounds.
3. Judges will be appointed, and their decisions will be final. No verbal or written communication will be entertained or considered.
4. **The organizers reserve the right to make any necessary decisions, inclusions, or changes to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without further notice.**
5. By entering this Competition, exhibitors acknowledge their compliance with these Conditions.
6. Judges at The Cairns Show are prohibited from having any prior or during judging information beyond what is provided by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral and Mining Association. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors are required to sign an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivering their entry and must adhere to the health requirements outlined in this document. Exhibit Health Declarations can be obtained from the Show Office or the website www.cairnsshow.com.au.
2. Owners of animals are responsible for any veterinary fees incurred. The Cairns Show will not assume responsibility for any veterinarian expenses.
3. Please take note of the following conditions for entry into the grounds:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be appropriately tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

The Prize Money listed in the Schedule does not include GST. GST will be added to the Prize Money for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

The Cairns Show Association uses the information you provide in Membership or entry applications to offer member services and to organize and conduct competitions at the Cairns Show. By applying for Membership or entering our competitions, you consent to provide details such as your name, address, and exhibit details. Competition details may be shared with the media and included in publications. Your information will not be disclosed for any other purpose without your consent, except as required by law.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

1. Refer to all General Conditions of Entry in the front of the schedule.
2. All cattle must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
3. All cattle must be registered with the respective breed societies.
4. The age of registered stud cattle is to be calculated from birth up to 1st July 2025. Breeding particulars must appear on Entry Form and Certificates of Registration must be available for section if required.
5. Exhibitors are requested to pay particular attention to the filling in of Entry Form and to supply all information asked for, as it is from this document that the catalogue will be compiled. Any incomplete nomination forms will require resubmission by the exhibitor.
6. Exhibitor's passes will be issued on receipt of Entry Form. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to collect passes:
1 beast = 1 pass, 2 or 3 beasts = 2 passes, 4 or more beasts = 3 passes.
7. All entries are received subject to the right of the Stewards to reject any cattle not up to Show standard and if required to arrange for same to be removed from the ground before judging commences.
8. Stewards retain the right to transfer any entry to a more suitable class or section. If not sufficient exhibits for a class or section, Stewards retain the right to transfer exhibits to another suitable class.
9. Unless agreed for static display by Chief Steward, no cattle are allowed as non-competitive.
10. All animals exhibited to be of good general health and free of transmittable diseases. A signed Health Certificate by owner or representative and copy of waybill must be provided on delivery of animals.
11. Feed will not be supplied by the Association.
12. Sand/Sawdust will be provided for bedding. Bedding hay will be provided for dairy cattle only.
13. On arrival at the grounds, all cattle must be penned by the owner or his representative and all transport vehicles will be required to be removed from the grounds immediately once unloading is completed.
14. Dust coats must be worn at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
15. Bulls over the age of 12 months must be nose ringed, with lead attached when handled on the grounds. Female Cattle over the age of 12 months must be nose ringed or dogged, with lead attached when handled on the grounds. For safety, accommodation and courtesy reasons, neck straps or neck chains must be used.
16. In the event of an exhibit in any one class not being worthy of a prize, no prize money will be awarded.
17. A Parade of Champions will be held on Friday 18th July in the Main Arena.
18. Staves must be used on animals over 12 months when leading animals in the Parade.
19. Cattle entered for competition must not be removed from the grounds before 3pm Friday 18th July 2024 unless prior arrangements are made with the Chief Steward.
20. No camping is permitted inside the Showgrounds. Limited facilities are available in Barlow Park. Apply on Camp Application Form by 5pm, 27th June 2025.
21. No dipping facilities are available at the Showgrounds, therefore exhibitors from tick free and protected areas will need to have their stock treated at a DPI line clearance centre on the way home.
22. Random mouthing may be undertaken.
23. All animals to be exhibited must be registered with the National Livestock Identification System (NLIS).
24. Any calf shown on a cow is not eligible to be shown in any calf class. The maximum age of a calf on a cow is 8 months as at 1st July.
25. Stud Cattle (heifers) entered in stud classes cannot be entered into Led Heifer classes.
26. Late entries may be accepted up to the discretion of the Chief Steward.
27. Enquiries or disputes must be discussed with the Chief Steward. The Show Office will not be able to deal with disputes as the office is for administrative purposes only.
28. Where there are insufficient nominations, the Chief Steward has the discretion to review and replace classes where appropriate.
29. Washing of animals is to occur in the designated wash down area only. Competitors to vacate this area immediately after use.
30. The use of cattle blowers is to be restricted to the designated areas.

HOW TO ENTER

1. Complete an Entry online or in person at the Cairns Show Office, or post via PO Box 811 Bungalow, QLD 4870.
2. Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
3. Pay for Entry Fees online, by direct deposit, or in person at the Cairns Show Office (cash accepted).
4. Entries must be delivered to the designated part of the Showgrounds by the due date time and date shown.

YOUNG JUDGES & PARADERS

1. Official entry form must be signed by all competitors. Competitors under the age of 18 years of age must have parent or guardian approval to compete.
2. **Competitors are to be a resident in Queensland** for at least three months prior to competing or attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under the rule below.
3. **Competitors residing over the border** who can prove affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided they satisfy one of the following:
 - Their address has a Queensland postcode.
 - They have a Queensland phone number.
 - The competitor or their parents are active working members of that Show.
4. **Attire:** Paraders must wear a white dust coat and not display any name or logo at the steward's discretion.
5. **Regulations:** Please refer to the QCAS website www.queenslandshows.com.au for Sub Chamber regulations.

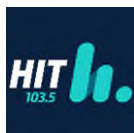
