ENTRY & COMPETITIONS

This Show operates in accordance with the regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the Constitution and Rules of the Cairns Agricultural, Pastoral and Mining Association (CAPMA), and the regulations outlined within each section of this Show Schedule. In the event of any inconsistency, the rules and regulations contained within this Society's Schedule will take precedence.

By participating in any class within this Schedule, all exhibitors and competitors agree to indemnify the Cairns Agricultural, Pastoral and Mining Association against any liability for accidents, damage, loss, or illness involving any exhibit, exhibitor, or competitor. All competitions are conducted under the full authority of CAPMA, and all decisions made by the Association are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

1. Competition entries and membership applications will not be accepted over the phone.
2. Each Section will have an appointed Chief Steward responsible for representing that Section in all matters. Failure to follow lawful directions from Stewards, Committee Members, or Staff, or any form of verbal or physical abuse, may result in disciplinary action, including exclusion from competitions and/or removal from the Cairns Showgrounds.
3. Judges will be appointed, and all judging decisions are final. No correspondence, verbal or written, will be entered.
4. **The Association reserves the right to make decisions, additions, or amendments to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without notice.**
5. By entering any competition, exhibitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all Conditions of Entry.
6. Judges must not have access to any information beyond that provided by CAPMA. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their direct control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors must complete an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivery of their entry and comply with all health requirements outlined in the declaration. Forms are available from the Show Office or at www.cairnsshow.com.au.
2. Animal owners are responsible for all veterinary costs incurred. The Cairns Show will not cover veterinary expenses.
3. Entry to the grounds is subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be tested and tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be always kept on a leash.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

Prize money listed in the Schedule is exclusive of GST. GST will be added for exhibitors registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a Recipient Created Tax Invoice to eligible exhibitors.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

SECTION 1 EQUESTRIAN

HOW TO ENTER

1. Entry cards can be purchased in Centre Ring every day of the Show, they must be completed with name, horses name, class and number. Refer to the 'Entry Cards' information available below.
2. Equestrian & Dressage Entries will not be accepted over the phone.
3. Complete a Pre Nomination *as above*.
4. Competitors must report with their Class Card to the designated Ring Steward by the due time and date.
5. Equestrian and Dressage Prize Money must be collected during the show.
6. Prize cards, proof of identity or agent's authorisation are required to collect Prize Money.

ENTRY CARDS

- Purchase Entry Cards from the Centre Ring Office during the Show. Entry Cards must be purchased prior to competition in bulk form (e.g. if competitor intends to enter 14 classes - purchase 14 cards).
- When the respective class is called, the entry card is given to the Ring Steward. They must be filled in with class numbers, horse and owner's name. Fill in Indemnity card on back of entry card.
- **No Card = No Entry = No Excuses**

ENTRY WRISTBANDS/CAR PASSES

1. Competitors entering on the day of the Show will be allowed access via the Severin Street Gate, wristbands/car passes should be arranged with the Cairns Show Office prior to the Show, so that wristbands/car passes can be collected from Severin Street Gate upon arrival. However, wristbands may be available at the Severin Street Gate during the Show from Security. The Severin Street Gate will be open from 6.30am.
2. Competitors' entry passes will be issued as follows:
 - 1 Horse = 1 pass
 - 2 or 3 Horses = 2 passes
 - 4 or more Horses = 3 passes
3. Any other drivers or passengers in the vehicle will be required to pay entry fees or produce Membership / Pre-purchased passes to gate security at the time of entry.
4. For those that have pre-nominated, your wristbands and car passes will be available for collection from the Severin Street Gate.
5. For those who are Camping, your passes will be available for collection from the Scott Street Gate or Show Office.

ACCESS & FLOAT PARKING

- All vehicles except genuine camping vehicles for which a site has been allocated and fees paid MUST leave the Show grounds (including Barlow Park) by 8:30 am each day of the Cairns Show. Float Park is available in Centre Ring as directed.
- The ONLY exception to the above is competitors in Led/Ridden/Harness Classes on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday who will be permitted to park floats on the southern end and sides of the arena but not the grandstand end of the arena. Floats must be removed by the commencement of the afternoon General Entertainment program or as directed by the Ring Master/Chief Ring Steward.
- Barlow Park: All floats or vehicles without an official permit will be removed without exception at the owner's expense.

SECTION 1 EQUESTRIAN

CAMPING & STABLING

1. Camping and Stabling is under the strict control of Camp Steward and Stabling Steward. Any person who fails to carry out the instructions of these Stewards will be dealt with severely by the Cairns Show Committee.
2. Limited Camping and Stabling facilities are available.
 - Camping in the Barlow Park area is only permitted between 14th and 21st July 2026, unless prior arrangements are made with the Show Office.
 - Stabling preference will be given to competitors south of Gordonvale and North of Palm Cove. Limited undercover stables inside the grounds are available and competitors must supply own shavings or bedding hay.
3. To apply for Camping and/or Stabling, complete the official application form and forward to the Show Office with fees. You will receive a Camping Permit which must be affixed outside of the Camping Unit near the main entry door. You will also receive a Stable Number/s.
4. **The Camping and Stabling Stewards decisions are final.**

CAIRNS SHOW INDEMNITY FORM

All competitors and their assistants are required to read and sign the indemnity form available from the Centre Ring Office. The indemnity form is located at the back of Entry Cards available from the Centre Ring Office. The Indemnity form is located on the back of the Entry Cards.

HORSE HEALTH DECLARATION FORM

It is important that each person intending on bringing a horse to this upcoming competition fills out the Horse Health Declaration Form and hands to the Centre Ring Office. Horse Health Declaration Forms will be available from the Cairns Show Office, Show Website and from the Centre Ring Office during the Show.

SENSORY HAIR

The clipping / shaving or otherwise modifying sensory hairs (whiskers) has been prohibited unless for veterinary reasons.

From 1st January 2025, horses found competing with hair in the auricles removed or shortened within the rims of the auricle will be eliminated from the event.

See EA General Regulations, Chapter IV Protection of Athletes and Horses, Article 141 - Protection of Horses for more information.

ATTIRE

All handlers and assistants must be suitably attired while in the Main Arena and judging rings. Judges and exhibitors to always wear suitable hats when in the ring. Shorts, singlets, thongs and similar attire will not be permitted.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize Money will be paid on completion of the Event by the Ring Steward or Judge. Prize Money is as stated. All Money not collected during the Show will be forfeited.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Please Read Special Regulations for The Class You Are Entering Thoroughly

1. Refer to the General Conditions of Entry & Competition in front of schedule.
2. All horses in Ring 1 MUST be registered. Riders/owners MUST be members of the EA except in Junior Events. Jumping events are conducted under EA rules.
3. Horses competing in junior competitions are allowed to compete graded at the steward's discretion.
4. The age of all horses is to be calculated from the 1st of August.
5. Name of horse must be stated at the time of entry or nomination will not be accepted.
6. No horse will be permitted to commence unless entry fees are paid in full.
7. Horses must be free from hereditary unsoundness.
8. All competitors must report to Ring 1, 2, 3, 4 immediately when instructed to do so by Call Steward or Ring Stewards.
9. Groom or others in charge of horses must obey orders of Stewards or be subjected to a fine or ejected from the grounds.
10. Adult riders are 18 years and over. Junior riders are 17 years and under.
11. No parent to enter the Judging Ring with junior competitors except in Special Class Pairs and Rider Classes under 7 years.
12. The Judge shall withhold awards where exhibits are not of sufficient merit especially in awarding Championship Prizes.
13. All horses entered in Led Classes which culminate with awarding Champion and Reserve for that breed must be registered in the Stud Book of the Breed recognised by the Royal National Association. All exhibits in Led Classes are to be led into the Ring unless otherwise stated.
14. Local horses must be nominated, controlled, ridden and owned by a local resident.
15. Local shall mean:
 - as applying to horses - any horse which has been in the Cairns Region for six (6) months or more, immediately preceding the forthcoming Show.
 - as applying to residents - any person who has resided in the Cairns Region for one year or more, immediately preceding the forthcoming Show.
 - District - the district embraces all the territory north from Mackay and west to Mt Isa taking in the towns of Charters Towers, Hughenden, Julia Creek, Cloncurry and Mt Isa.
 - District shall mean the EA registered address of the Competitor
16. Ponies/Galloways/Horses are subject to re-measurement by the Stewards, if requested.
17. Pony Hack and Pony Hunter Hack over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult.
18. All small Pony Hacks and Hunter Pony Hacks 12.2 hands (127.5cm) and under to be ridden by a Juvenile rider 12 years and under.
19. A person who has attained the age of twelve (12) may ride in the Open Hack and Galloway ring.
20. In events restricted to children a copy of their Birth Certificate may be requested. Juniors and young riders should check their EA Rules and Regulations with regards to age, etc. Age to be as at the first day of the Show.
21. No substitution of a person or animal will be allowed without the permission of the Ring Committee. Any person or animal entered without permission will be disqualified.
22. Stallions are to be shown in appropriate bridles or halters or equipment authorised by the breed society. Stallions and mares in all Led in Classes must be three (3) years and over unless otherwise stated in schedule. Colts and fillies must be under three (3) years unless otherwise stated in a particular class number in this schedule.
23. All persons handling Stallions in Led classes must be over the age of 18 years
24. Stallions are not permitted in any Hack Events unless otherwise stated. Any stallion that, in the opinion of Stewards, is uncontrollable will be asked to leave the Show Ring.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

25. Scratching's to be carried out before 9:00 am each day of Show with Chief Ring Steward. Scratching's will only be refunded if entry cards have not been written on.
26. Times for commencement of individual events listed in the schedule are listed as a general guide only.
27. Competitors nominated in two (2) rings where a time clash occurs must make a choice in which Ring they will compete. Approval to hold up a Ring will be in the direction of the Chief Steward.
28. All horses in ridden classes must be ridden on the circle to be eligible for the event.
29. Grand Parade - Friday 17th July. All competitors are requested to participate.
30. Cruelty or raping will not be condoned and will be dealt with severely by the Ring Committee.

On the basis of these conditions competitors and their assistants indemnify the EA and the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association against all liability (including liability for their negligence, competitors or their assistant negligence & the negligence of others) for all injury, loss or damage (including property damage) arising out of or in connection with a competitors Participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law but only to the extent that they are not already indemnified or insured.
35. Competitors must declare that horses, saddlery and themselves are in sound condition and that they take up this competition with knowledge of the physical demands that this competition requires. - Any horse which has been presented for or competed in an event, and which is found to have been administered a prohibited substance shall be disqualified from the event and may be disqualified from competing in any further events for such period as the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association thinks fit.
- A swab sample shall only be taken by a veterinary surgeon authorised by the Cairns Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association.
- All competitors indemnify Cairns Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association for any penalties imposed upon Cairns Agricultural Pastoral & Mining Association stemming from Equestrian competition should a positive swab occur.
- Competitors will be responsible for any costs associated with swabbing should a positive swab be returned.

- **Refunds:** No refund on nomination fees will be given after the closing date unless a Vet's or Doctor's certificate is produced. 30% of the nomination fee will be withheld by the club for administration.
- **Stabling:** Stabling/day yards are available on the competition grounds for horses competing on the day. Stables need to be booked directly through Venue Management: karen@crystalcascadeshorsepark.com.au. Cost is \$15/Night. Preference for stables is given to participants travelling from outside Cairns and camping on the grounds. All horses staying overnight on the Crystal Cascades Horse Park must be Hendra Vaccinated and certified up to date.
- **Presentation of Ribbons and Prize Money:** There will be a presentation of ribbons and prize money with Show Officials and Sponsors in attendance after the last test on Sunday.
- **Draw:** You will be sent a copy of the draw via email. Please check the draw for your task and please be on time for these tasks. If you do not receive a copy of the draw by Wednesday 8th July, it is your responsibility to email the FNEG Secretary at fneg.info@gmail.com.
- **Rule Change:** From the 1 January 2024, all competitors are required to present to the Steward and complete a gear check immediately after riding each test. The steward may conduct a visual inspection when you enter the warmup area, however the formal gear check now occurs immediately after completion of the test. Failure to have a gear check after your test will result in elimination.
- **Tasks/Jobs:** All Competitors should expect to be allocated a job each day of the competition, usually 2 hours duration. Nominate your preferred task on the entry form though the Committee who will allocate tasks as needed.
- **Tests:** Copies of all tests are on the EA National Website.
- **BYO:** Cold drinks and food. Tea and coffee are available on the grounds.
- **Dogs:** are not allowed onto the Crystal Cascades Horse Park grounds at all.
- **It is recommended that all horses be plaited as a sign of respect for the judges.**
- **The Committee reserves the right to alter, amend or cancel any event on the program without notice.**

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Terms used in the Schedule:
 1. CUR – Closed Unrestricted.
 2. CR – Closed Restricted.
 3. OC – Official Competitive.
 4. ALL classes are included. Riders may not compete in Official and CUR/CR competitions on the same horse.
- Only compete at two consecutive levels per event (regardless of number of days).
 - Eg: Preparatory/Preliminary, Preliminary/Novice, Novice/Elementary, Elementary/Medium, Medium Advanced.
- Nominations not to exceed a maximum of two tests per day, per horse/rider combination. Rules change in January 2026.
- After the closing of entries any change of rider must be notified, in writing, of the OC no later than 40 minutes prior to the start of the competition. However, the rider of a horse may not be changed if another rider has ridden the horse on the day, either in warm-up or in a competition.
- One rider per horse, a horse cannot be substituted.
- Junior riders (0 to 16yrs) age as of 1st January 2026.
- Junior riders may enter one age group only.
- Senior Riders (17 years onwards) age as of 1st January 2026.
- All riders are required to help throughout the event, if no preference is nominated on the entry form, then you will be allocated a job by the organising committee.



OFFICIAL COMPETITIONS

- All Official EA competitions, with the exception of National and State Championships and Prix St Georges Challenge, are open to both horses and ponies. Any pony entries received shall be grouped at the beginning or the end of the draw (or at another time if the OC requires) and shall be scored as a separate competition for the horses in the rest of the test though separate prizes will not be awarded.
- EA official riders must enter Official competitions at their graded level or above or ride HC in competitions below their level; however, HC competitors will not be eligible for prize money.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure the nominations are made correctly at the horses graded level at the time of entry close date.
- Dress code as per EA current rules and regulations.
- Horses entered in official competitions must be:
 1. Registered with the EA and owned by a current financial EA member.
 2. Have EA registration papers available on the day of event.
 3. Have a current Dressage Performance Card.
 4. Identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse, either on the bridle or saddle cloth.
- Riders may enter Official competition:
 1. From the start of the calendar year, they turn 10 years of age when riding horses.
 2. From the start of the calendar year, they turn 8 years of age when riding ponies.
 3. Provided they are a Junior or Senior financial member of the EA.
- CUR and CR COMPETITIONS
 - No restriction on age for riders, no restriction on the height of the horse/pony
 - If a horse/pony is graded, it may only compete at its graded level or higher, or HC at a lower level
 - Identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse, either on the bridle or saddle cloth.
 - Dress code – sleeved shirts and tie, stock or Ratcatcher. Jackets are optional in hot weather.

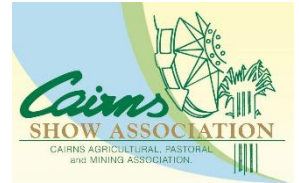

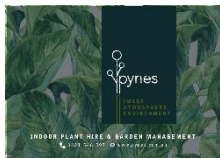
