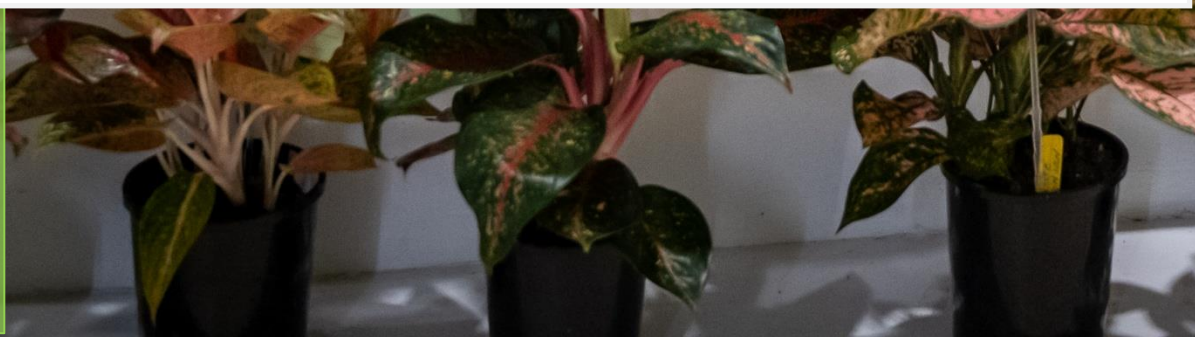

ENTRY & COMPETITIONS

This Show operates in accordance with the regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the Constitution and Rules of the Cairns Agricultural, Pastoral and Mining Association (CAPMA), and the regulations outlined within each section of this Show Schedule. In the event of any inconsistency, the rules and regulations contained within this Society's Schedule will take precedence.

By participating in any class within this Schedule, all exhibitors and competitors agree to indemnify the Cairns Agricultural, Pastoral and Mining Association against any liability for accidents, damage, loss, or illness involving any exhibit, exhibitor, or competitor. All competitions are conducted under the full authority of CAPMA, and all decisions made by the Association are final.

THE CAIRNS AGRICULTURAL PASTORAL AND MINING ASSOCIATION

1. Competition entries and membership applications will not be accepted over the phone.
2. Each Section will have an appointed Chief Steward responsible for representing that Section in all matters. Failure to follow lawful directions from Stewards, Committee Members, or Staff, or any form of verbal or physical abuse, may result in disciplinary action, including exclusion from competitions and/or removal from the Cairns Showgrounds.
3. Judges will be appointed, and all judging decisions are final. No correspondence, verbal or written, will be entered.
4. **The Association reserves the right to make decisions, additions, or amendments to this Schedule, including Conditions of Entry and Special Regulations, without notice.**
5. By entering any competition, exhibitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all Conditions of Entry.
6. Judges must not have access to any information beyond that provided by CAPMA. Vice Presidents are not permitted to compete in sections under their direct control.

ANIMAL AND BIRD EXHIBITORS

1. All animal and bird exhibitors must complete an Exhibit Health Declaration upon delivery of their entry and comply with all health requirements outlined in the declaration. Forms are available from the Show Office or at www.cairnsshow.com.au.
2. Animal owners are responsible for all veterinary costs incurred. The Cairns Show will not cover veterinary expenses.
3. Entry to the grounds is subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Glass items are prohibited on the grounds.
 - b. All electrical leads must be tested and tagged in accordance with relevant industrial regulations.
 - c. Dogs must be always kept on a leash.

PRIZE MONEY & GST

Prize money listed in the Schedule is exclusive of GST. GST will be added for exhibitors registered for GST purposes. The Association will issue a Recipient Created Tax Invoice to eligible exhibitors.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

Collection of Exhibits: NO entries may be removed before 8pm on **Friday 17th July**. Entries can be collected from 8:30pm-9:00pm on **Friday 17th**, or between 7am-9am **Saturday 18th July**.

HOW TO ENTER

1. Fully complete the Official Entry Form (please use a separate form for each Section).
2. Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
3. Deliver completed entry forms, together with any applicable fees (excluding Floral Art), to the Cairns Show Association at the Honey Providore Horticulture Pavilion (Cairns Youth Centre) when submitting your exhibit.
4. Exhibits (excluding Floral Art) must be delivered to the designated place by the due time and date shown.

AFTER THE SHOW

- Exhibits must be collected between 7am-9am on **Saturday 18th July 2026** or will automatically become property of the Cairns Show Association.
- Prize Money and Certificate cannot be collected on Friday or Saturday.
- All exhibits in the Floral Arts Classes may collect their certificates on the day of collection.
- Prize Money can be collected between 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday, from **3rd August to the 28th August 2026** from the Show Office.
- Proof of identity is required to collect Prize Money. If you are collecting prize money on behalf of someone else, a letter of authorisation from that person will be required.
- All Prize Money not collected (Bar Non-Local) by 4pm on **28th August 2026** will be returned to the Cairns Show Association Funds.
- Prize Money over \$50 will be deposited to Non-Locals after **28th August 2026**.
- For the above purposes, a 'local' is described as residing between the areas of Palm Cove and Gordonvale and west to the range.
- Results will be available AFTER the Show has concluded from the Cairns Show Website www.cairnsshow.com.au.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- Refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition in front of Schedule.
- All exhibitors (excluding Floral Art) must fill in entry forms which must be lodged with exhibits.
- All exhibits in the Cut Flower Classes must be grown by the exhibitor or family. Pot Culture Exhibits, including Orchids and Terrariums, must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 6 months prior to the Show. Proved infringement of either of these rules may lead to cancellation of entry. Flowers used in Floral Art Classes may not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor. Materials used may be bought or obtained from any other source.
- In every case except Aggregates, Champions or unless otherwise stated, no individual entry shall be eligible to compete in more than one class. Points allotted for aggregates and other special awards are as follows: 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, 1 for 3rd, 3 extra for Champion and 6 extra for Grand Champion and 3 extra for Reserve Champion.
- Containers are provided by the Show Association for Cut Flowers and Flowering Shrubs.
- Orchid exhibitors must provide their own containers which should have an identifying mark.
- Floral Art designs must be displayed as a single unit (i.e. provide a base if the design is composed of several parts).
- No entries in Pot Culture, Orchids or Floral Art may be removed from hall before 8.30pm **Friday 17th July 2026**. Exhibits can also be collected **Saturday 18th July** between 7am-9am.
- No free passes are available to exhibitors.
- Judging will conform with the Standards as laid down by the Far North Queensland Horticultural Society.
- Judging for Floral Art will conform with the Standards laid down by The Australian Floral Art Association.

BIO SECURITY & PLANT RESTRICTIONS

- Plant material must comply with **Queensland biosecurity regulations**.
- The following prohibited or restricted plants must **not** be used:
 - **Lantana** (Lantana camara & L. montevidensis)
 - **Mother of Millions** (Bryophyllum delagoense & hybrids)
 - **Cacti**: Harrisia cactus, Cholla cactus, Bunny Ears cactus
 - **Vines/Creepers**: Madeira vine, Climbing Asparagus fern, Kudzu, Rubber vine
 - **Aquatic Plants**: Water hyacinth, Sagittaria, Salvinia
 - **Shrubs/Trees**: Yellow bells, Groundsel bush, Chinese privet
 - **Other weeds**: Singapore daisy, Fireweed, Siam weed
 - **Important Considerations**:
 - Category 3 restricted plants (including certain cacti) are **illegal to sell, trade, or swap**.
 - Movement of Myrtaceae plants (e.g., bottlebrush, tea tree, eucalyptus) may be restricted due to Myrtle Rust.
 - Some native plants are protected - collecting them from the wild is illegal.
 - Entrants should check the **Business Queensland website** for the most current biosecurity restrictions and updates.

Points:

Culture = 4 points

Symmetry & Finish = 3 points

Pot = 3 points

Total = 10 points

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please refer to General Conditions of Entry & Competition located in front of the Schedule, along with the Special Regulations of Section 22 Horticulture.

Entries Per Class: Not more than 4 entries per plant class per person.

Pots: Plastic only - not exceeding 9 litre capacity.

Baskets: Not to exceed 350mm in diameter - clean.

Support: Stakes, wires, hoops etc. allowed.

Plants: In proportion to pot size - clean and healthy (no dead leaves or insect damage).

Ownership: Entries to be in exhibitors' possession for at least six months.

Definitions:

- Single - stemmed plants should be planted singularly.
- Plants - suckering may have multiple stems, parent stem to be in good condition.
- Foliage plants are grown for foliage.
- Flowering plants grown for flowers - should have multiple flowers.
- Mixed planting - no less than 3 distinct plants arranged to fill pot or basket.

Entries may be refused or cancelled if the above conditions are not met.

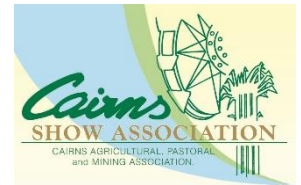
